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HIKING IS ONE OF THE BEST WAYS TO GET FIRSTHAND EXPERIENCE OF ALL THE NATURAL AREAS THAT ARAGON HAS TO OFFER, FROM THE SOUTHERNMOST GLACIERS IN EUROPE, FOUND ON THE HIGHEST PEAKS OF THE PYRENEES, TO THE ARID STEPPES OF THE EBRO VALLEY AND THE FASCINATING MOUNTAIN RANGES OF TERUEL.

## / HIKING TRAILS OF ARAGON

In terms of landscapes and natural beauty, Aragon is exceptional. It is famous for the highest peaks in the Pyrenees, with Pico de Aneto as the loftiest peak; the Pre-Pyrenean mountain ranges, with Guara and the Mallos de Riglos as popular destinations for adventure sports worldwide; and the Iberian System, with Mount Moncayo as its highest peak and some of the most breathtakingly rugged terrain in Teruel.

The wild beauty of the mountains is offset by the Ebro depression, with the scenery found around the fastest flowing river on the Iberian Peninsula, as well as the unique steppes surrounding it. Just as spectacular is the endorheic basin of Gallocanta, with its large herds of cranes and the many birds visiting it and the countless nooks and crannies hidden among this landscape waiting to be discovered.





## HIKING ARAGON

**More than 20,000 kilometres of waymarked trails, divided into about 600 routes of all levels of difficulty, distance, elevation change and skill, which covers all of Aragon.**

Options are many and varied: from the Long-Distance Paths (some of which are world-famous) to the more family-friendly Local Trails, with a great number of Short-Distance Paths and many other kinds of trails.

These trails are, without a doubt, great tourist draws, which is why the regional government is promoting the network of Hiking Trails of Aragon.

The brand **Hiking Trails of Aragon** guarantees quality and safety for users, encompassing aspects such as their maintenance over time and joint promotional actions through different platforms: tourist brochures like this one, the website [senderosturisticos.turismodearagon.com](http://senderosturisticos.turismodearagon.com) and the app developed for this purpose.

Indeed, the reason for regulating the trails of Aragon and creating this designation is to offer a homogeneous and easily identifiable product through waymarking, making hiking safe and enjoyable.

The new signage for the **Hiking Trails of Aragon** makes use of its own logo with all kinds of useful information: trail name, directional arrows, identifying marks for GR, PR and SL paths or other distinctive marks (Camino de Santiago, Nature Network of Aragon, etc.), distance expressed in kilometres, time according to the MIDE (Excursion Information Method), etc. In addition, different types of panels contribute towards proper interpretation of and familiarity with the trail.



Together with the **Hiking Trails of Aragon**, there are also trails that have not yet been given this designation, but are likewise of interest, which is why they were originally waymarked. There are those which are GR, PR or SL paths, while others are long-distance walking routes such as the Camino de Santiago or the Camino del Cid; still others are part of the Nature Trails Network of the Ministry of the Environment, while the rest are small yet delightful routes closer to home.

# / LONG-DISTANCE HIKING TRAILS





## GR 11 Pyrenean Trail

The GR 11, also known as the Pyrenean Trail, is one of the best places for mountaineering both locally and internationally. It is a Long-Distance Path that crosses the Pyrenees from the Atlantic to the Mediterranean in 46 stages. Within the Aragonese region, it runs along the loftiest peaks of this mountain range: Aneto (3404 m), Posets (3369 m) and Monte Perdido (3348 m), surrounded by many other three-thousanders. An excellent network of high mountain refuges can be found in the Aragonese section, providing a suitable base from which to tackle this great challenge with the necessary support amidst the breathtaking Pyrenees.

Distance: 348 km

Stages: 12 and 3 alternatives with several options



## GR 15 Pre-Pyrenean Route

The GR 15 crosses the entire province of Huesca parallel to the Pyrenean Trail, covering the mountain ranges below the highest summits. Mountains, gorges, idyllic meadows and large pine, mixed and deciduous forests are just some of the breathtakingly beautiful spots to be found, all of which come together in the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park. An authentic mountain culture and notable Romanesque monuments only add to its allure.

Distance: 274 km

Stages: 13 and 2 alternatives



## GR 262 River Martín

The GR 262 of Teruel is found amidst a magnificent backdrop of waterfalls, pleasant copses and impressive limestone canyons. Part of it is within the boundaries of the River Martín Cultural Park, an area which has been named a European Cultural Route for the set of prehistoric cave paintings found here, which has been declared a World Heritage Site.

Distance: 86 km (approx.)

Stages: 8





## GR 8 Eastern mountain ranges of Teruel

The GR 8 crosses the southeast part of the province of Teruel, starting from its boundary with Tarragona until the town of Camarena de la Sierra, where it meets the GR 10. It is the most rugged area of the Iberian Cordillera in Teruel. This is why the GR 8.1 is surrounded by outstanding natural landmarks, such as the Natural Monuments of the Natural Bridge of Fonseca, the Crystal Caves, the Órganos de Montoro and the source of the River Pitarque, with delightful urban areas dotted among them.

**Distance:** 241 km

**Stages:** 16 and 2 alternatives with several options each



## Iberian System in Zaragoza

The GR 90 crosses the mountain ranges of the Iberian System in Zaragoza, with the Moncayo dominating the landscape, making a large part of it highly distinctive. Another natural and cultural area of note is the group of mountain ranges surrounding the Jalón pass.

**Distance:** 112 km (approx.)

**Stages:** 5 stages and 2 alternatives



## GR 10 Western mountain ranges of Teruel

Similar to the GR 8, the Aragonese GR 10 path also runs along the Iberian Cordillera in Teruel, where the Pinares de Rodeno Protected Landscape and the Albarracín Cultural Park—with its many small caves with prehistoric art and the town of Albarracín itself—are some of its greatest natural and cultural attractions, as well as the Sierra de Javalambre mountains and the Montes Universales, the source of the Tagus River.

**Distance:** 189 km

**Stages:** 12 and 1 alternative with 6 stages



## GR 24 Iberian Cordillera in Zaragoza and Teruel

The GR 24 runs along the central mountain ranges of the Iberian System, revealing amazing nooks and crannies in the provinces of Teruel and Zaragoza. One of the most stunning spots is the Gallocanta Lagoon, which is one of the most important wetlands in Europe. The rivers Mesa and Piedra, with their deep limestone gorges, further add to the beauty of this rugged landscape. Historic sites, such as the Castle of Peracense or the nearby Monasterio de Piedra, can also be found.

**Distance:** 167 km (approx.)

**Stages:** 8 and 1 alternative

### Ebro Nature Trail GR 99

From Fontibre in Cantabria, to El Garxal Lighthouse in Tarragona, the River Ebro crosses 930 km through the widest and most extensive basin on the Peninsula. It winds through the Aragonese region, forming winding meanders, surrounded by imposing gypsum escarpments and copses, giving rise to countless galachos (abandoned meanders) and mejanas or river islets.

Distance: 291 km (approx.)  
Stages: 15 and 6 alternatives



### Nature Trail of Somontano of Barbastro

The Sierra y Cañones de Guara Natural Park and the River Vero Cultural Park are home to this Nature Trail, which runs along spectacular gorges and a noteworthy prehistoric, medieval and popular heritage.






### Hoya de Huesca Nature Trail

The Hoya de Huesca Nature Trail, which connects to the Somontano de Barbastro Nature Trail at the Berge diversion dam (Huesca), continues on through the fascinating outer mountain ranges of the Pre-Pyrenees, with the Mallos de Riglos as one of the landmarks waiting to be discovered.

Distance: 133.10 km  
Stages: 8





 **Matarraña Nature Trail**

This Nature Trail runs along one of the best preserved Mediterranean rivers in Aragon. With its start point at the emblematic setting of El Parrizal, right in the Puertos de Beceite, the route follows the river's course through the Matarraña and Caspe-Lower Aragon regions.


Distance: 76.5 km  
Stages: 7 and 1 alternative



 **Camino de Santiago francés GR 65.3**

Inscribed into the World Heritage List by the UNESCO in 1993, it is a Cultural Interest Site in the Aragonese region and waymarked as GR 65.3. The Camino Francés follows the course of the River Aragon, from the border crossing pass of Somport until the border with Navarre. Its surroundings hold splendid examples of Romanesque art, such as Jaca Cathedral and the Monastery of San Juan de la Peña, with the churches of Siresa and Santa Cruz de la Serós as other fine examples.

Distance: 97.7 km (approx.)  
Stages: 5 and 4 alternatives



 **Camino del Cid GR 160**

The Camino del Cid, waymarked as GR 160, revolves around the figure of Rodrigo Díaz de Vivar. In Aragon, it crosses former Moorish territories where the Castilian warrior began to impose his law, through Ateca and Calatayud, it traverses old lands from the taifa kingdoms of Zaragoza and Albarracín, and lastly, it enters the province of Teruel going to Valencia. What's ore, it takes you near the Gallocanta Lagoon, in the town of Montalbán and the Maestrazgo region in Teruel. Certain areas of the route make it possible to appreciate many of the black poplars (Cultural Interest Site).

Distance: 345.5 km (approx.)  
Stages: 17 and 1 diversion



## **Vuelta a los Tres Refugios**

A classic of the Pyrenean routes in the surroundings of the GR 11, that unites, in various combinations, the Angel Orús, Viadós and Estos shelters around the massif of the Posets or Llardana (3369 m), second highest peak in the Pyrenees.

Municipality: Benasque, Gistaín, San Juan de Plan and Eriste | Region: La Ribagorza and Sobrarbe  
Circular | 45.4 km | 3255 m+ | 3255 m-  
19 h 30 min (Data from Estós parking)



## **Vuelta a la Gran Facha**

The Gran Facha or Facha (3005 m) is a prominent pyramid, whose top makes boundary between France and Spain, in the area of the Tena Valley. The circuit in stages joins the shelters of Respomuso and Ibones de Bachimana, in Spanish territory, and of Wallon, in Gallic lands.

Municipality: Sallent de Gállego and Panticosa, passing through | Region: Alto Gállego  
Circular | 35.2 km | 2435 m+ | 2435 m-  
14 h 30 min (Data from the Bachimaña shelter)



## **Vuelta al Aneto**

To surround the highest summit of the Pyrenees, the Aneto (3404 m), is to walk close to the largest accumulation of 'three thousand' of the Pirineos. The refuges of The Renclusa and Cap de Llauset, in the tracing of the GR 11.5 and GR 11, respectively, offer their support.

Municipality: Benasque and Montanuy  
Region: La Ribagorza  
Circular | 41.3 km | 2425 m+ | 2425 m-

## / WALKS AND EXCURSIONS

## HUESCA



### Pradera de Ordesa- Cola de Caballo (GR 11)

One of the classic hiking routes in Aragon, it takes you right into the heart of the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park, crossing the Ordesa Canyon, surrounded by its forests and many waterfalls.

Municipality: Torla | Region: Sobrarbe  
Round trip | 18,1 km | 580 m+ | 580 m- | 5 h 55 min



### Balneario de Panticosa Spa-Ibones Azules (GR 11)

The route through the Tena Valley makes it possible to get a close look at the famous health resort in the Pyrenees and some mountain lakes amidst the three-thousanders in the area, such as the Picos de l'Inferno, at the foot of which are the idyllic Ibones Azules.

Municipality: Panticosa | Region: Alto Gállego  
Round trip | 12,6 km | 905 m+ | 905 m- | 5 h 55 min



### Forau de Aiguallut from La Besurta (GR 11.5)

At the head of the Benasque Valley, at the foot of the Aneto-Maladetsa massif, this easy excursion pays a visit to the Forau d'Aiguallut, a glacier sinkhole that appears on the other side of the Pyrenees in the Val d'Aran, giving rise to the River Garonne that flows into the Atlantic Ocean.

Municipality: Benasque | Region: La Ribagorza  
Round trip | 3,9 km | 140 m+ | 140 m- | 1 h



### Lizara-Ibón de Estanés (GR 11)

From the plains of Lizara and its refuge, at the Aragüés del Puerto Valley, the GR 11 climbs to enter the Sarrios Valley, amidst imposing rocky folds and peat bogs, to descend to the majestic Ibón de Estanés afterwards.

Municipality: Aragüés del Puerto and Ansó  
Region: La Jacetania  
Round trip | 17,2 km | 970 m+ | 970 m- | 6 h 20 min



  **La Sarra-  
Respomuso refuge (GR 11)**

High mountain route right through the Tena Valley which, along the Pyrenean Trail or GR 11, reaches the dammed Respomuso mountain lake, near the refuge with the same name, amidst the ruggedly beautiful setting of the Cirque of Piedrafita, very close to France.

Municipality: Sallent de Gállego | Region: Alto Gállego  
Round trip | 16,5 km | 820 m+ | 820 m- | 6 h 05 min



  **Formigal-Ibones de Anayet (GR 11)**

The Ibones de Anayet are found against the idyllic backdrop of the Tena Valley, at the foot of Pico de Anayet (2574 m) and within sight of the unmistakable Midi d'Ossau in France. The excursion, from the surrounding areas of Formigal, crosses a landscape that showcases the great beauty of the Pyrenees.

Municipality: Sallent de Gállego | Region: Alto Gállego  
Round trip | 11,3 km | 645 m+ | 645 m- | 4 h 35 min



  **Alquézar  
Walkways (GR 1.1)**

The spectacular village of Alquézar gives you the chance not only to enjoy its castle and collegiate church, as well as its popular Pre-Pyrenean architecture, but also this route which, closely following the gorge that channels the River Vero, runs along its waters in a fascinating path.

Region: Somontano de Barbastro

 **Montfalcó  
Walkways  
(Nature Trail)**

Considered to be one of the 10 best high-altitude hiking trails in Spain, it consists of a spectacular route along walkways cantilevered from the rock face which ends at a hanging bridge over the River Noguera Ribagorzana, between Aragon and Catalonia, in front of the Mont-rebei Gorge.

## Through the Añisclo Canyon, from San Úrbez to La Ripareta (SA-1 Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park)

Route along the bottom of the Añisclo Canyon, one of the most emblematic settings of the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park, amidst rocky outcrops and leafy forests, which sets off from the cave hermitage of San Úrbez and reaches the level area of La Ripareta.

Municipality: Fanlo | Region: Sobrarbe  
Round trip | 15,4 km | 730 m+ | 730 m- | 5 h 30 min



## Pineta-Balcón de Pineta- Ibón de Marboré (SA-27 Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park)

Countless wild mushrooms can be found on the idyllic Cirque of Pineta, within sight of the waterfalls that give rise to the River Cinca, as you go towards the Marboré Plan and its mountain lake, located at the foot of the north face of Monte Perdido. This is where you can see one of the last glaciers in the Pyrenees.

Municipality: Bielsa | Region: Sobrarbe  
Crossing | 11,5 km | 1 825 m+ | 110 m- | 6 h 15 min



## Faja Pelay (SA-21 Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park)

At the heart of the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park, this circular route—despite being demanding—, gives you the chance to admire the beauty of the Ordesa Valley and the summits surrounding it in all their majesty, as you can do it from the height of the Faja Pelay and the bottom of the valley. Completely unforgettable.

Municipality: Torla | Region: Sobrarbe  
HIKE | 9,6 km | 150 m+ | 525 m- | 3 h 20 min



## Parking at the beginning of the Estós Valley- Ibonet de Batisielles- Ibón de Escarpinosa (S-3 Posets-Maladeta Natural Park)

Climbing up one of the most famous valleys in the Pyrenees—the Estós Valley—, the route turns to their south side, amidst a dense mixed forest, to get to the Ibonet de Batisielles, amidst pines and firs, and afterwards, the lovely Ibón de Escarpinosa.

Municipality: Benasque | Region: La Ribagorza  
Round trip | 13 km | 780 m+ | 780 m- | 4 h 50 min



  **Eriste-Ángel Orús refuge (PR-HU 36 and S-4 Posets-Maladeta Natural Park)**

Route through the Aigüeta de Grist Valley, amidst dense forests and within sight of waterfalls such as that of Espigantosa, which ends at the Ángel Orús refuge, from where many mountaineers begin the ascent to the second highest summit in the Pyrenees: Posets (3369 m).

Municipality: Eriste | Region: La Ribagorza  
Round trip | 18,2 km | 1 635 m+ | 1 635 m- | 9 h 55 min



   **Llauset-Botornás cabin-Ibón Cap de Llauset-Ibón de la Ubaga-Llauset (Posets-Maladeta Natural Park)**

Circular trail that showcases a splendid group of mountain lakes or *estany*s in the easternmost part of the Pyrenees in Aragon, visiting the great dammed Llauset mountain lake—its start and end point—and the smaller ones of Botornás, Cap de Llauset, Angliós and Ubaga.

Municipality: Montanuy | Region: La Ribagorza  
Circular | 8,2 km | 520 m+ | 520 m- | 3 h 15 min



 **Monasterio nuevo-Monasterio viejo de San Juan de la Peña (S-5 PP San Juan de la Peña y Monte Oroel)**

The S5 trail of the San Juan de la Peña y Monte Oroel Protected Landscape gives you the chance to enjoy the two locations of the most famous monastery in Aragon—considered to be the cradle of the kingdom—and the dense pine forests surrounding them, which is a truly magical experience.

Municipality: Jaca | Region: La Jacetania  
Round trip | 2 km | 164 m+ | 164 m- | 1 h



 **Rodellar-Losa Mora Dolmen- Otín-Rodellar (S-3 Sierra y Cañones de Guara Natural Park)**

The route goes into the legendary Mascún Ravine—a petrified landscape sculpted by nature into the limestone—and a lovely oak grove. Walk beside a mysterious prehistoric megalith and thousand-year-old towns that were left uninhabited by the mid-twentieth century.

Municipality: Bierge  
Region: Somontano de Barbastro

 **From Nocito to La Pizzera Ravine (S-8 Sierra y Cañones de Guara Natural Park)**

Nocito, one of the most iconic towns in the Sierra de Guara mountains, and the Brazo de Mar, a lake cave in the La Pizzera Ravine—called the Garden of Guara—, are found here on this route through the Pre-Pyrenees, one of the most popular ones for families and in summer.

Municipality: Nueno  
Region: Hoya de Huesca

## Discovering San Martín de la Bal d'Onsera

Excursion to one of the most evocative spots within the Sierra y Cañones de Guara Natural Park, which brings together popular beliefs and a fascinating landscape, in an inland journey to a cave hermitage that sacralises rock and water.

Municipality: Loporzano | Region: Hoya de Huesca  
Circular | 9,2 km | 685 m+ | 685 m- 4 h



## El Entremón (GR1)

The excursion enters the Entremón Gorge, which is crossed by the River Cinca, on a trail surrounded by thick forests, flanked by high rock walls and partly carved out of that rock itself, which makes for a spectacular high-altitude route.

Municipality: Abizanda y La Fueva | Region: Sobrarbe  
Round trip | 10 km | 660 m+ | 660 m- | 3 h 5 min



## Historic Trail through the Hecho Valley (GR 65.3.3 and PR-HU 21)

The combination of the GR 65.3.3 (alternative of the Camino de Santiago which descends the Hecho Valley) and the PR-HU 21 gives you the chance to explore both sides of the valley where the River Aragon Subordan runs, to bask in its forests and to walk along a Roman road.

Municipality: Valle de Echo | Region: La Jacetania  
Circular | 7,7 km | 460 m+ | 470 m- | 2 h 55 min



## Selva de Oza-Aguas Tuertas

The Selva de Oza forest is one of the loveliest beech-fir forests in the Pyrenees. After passing this forest environment and climbing along the River Aragon Subordan, the route reaches Guarrinza and the idyllic section of Aguas Tuertas, where megalithic remains abound.

Municipality: Valle de Echo y Ansó | Region: La Jacetania  
Round trip | 19,4 km | 555 m+ | 555 m- | 5 h 50 min



## From Casa de la Mina to Ibón de Acherito

At the entrance to Guarrinza—a section of the upper valley of the Aragon Subordan brimming with megaliths—the route that leads to the Ibón de Acherito begins, sheltered in a cirque protecting rocky ridges full of life, a lovely spot in the easternmost part of the Pyrenees in Aragon.

Municipality: Valle de Ansó  
Region: La Jacetania  
Round trip | 10,4 km  
670 m+ | 670 m- | 3 h 40 min



## Hiking Trails of Montanuy (PR-HU 100, 101 and 102)

Three charming routes in the municipality of Montanuy in Ribagorza: 'Camino de la Montaña' (PR-HU 100) in the small town of Denuy, which lets you explore the beauty of the valley of the River Baliera; 'Ruta de los Pueblos' (PR-HU 101), characterised by local colour, connecting the towns of Montanuy, Benifons, Noales and Escanés; and 'Ruta de la Serra' (PR-HU 102), which runs along part of a transhumant livestock route in the Castanesa region.



## Route to the Mallos de Riglos

Their verticality (up to 300 m) and cyclopean appearance have made them a mecca for rock climbers from all over the world. The circular route surrounding them gives you the chance to take in all their splendour, under the watchful gaze of vultures and rock climbers.

## Through Foz de Salinas (PR-HU 97)

The Foz de Salinas is a lovely gorge open on the north face of the Pre-Pyrenean mountain range of Santo Domingo. The PR that crosses it (from the town of Villalangua or the town of Salinas de Jaca) leads to La Osqueta Pass, a magnificent viewpoint amidst vertical rock strata.

Municipality: Las Peñas de Riglos | Region: Hoya de Huesca  
Circular | 9,6 km | 570 m+ | 570 m- | 4 h 40 min



## Ascent to Pico de Peiró from Arguis

Climb without much technical difficulty to Pico de Peiró (1586 m) in the Sierra de Gratal mountains, where you can enjoy a gorgeous forest environment of pine forests at the beginning and beech forests afterwards, as well as excellent views of many other Pyrenean and Pre-Pyrenean summits from the very top.

Round trip | 7,1 km | 495 m+ | 495 m- | 3 h 20 min

## From Oliván to Ainielle (PR-HU 3 and 4)

Sobrepuerto is a subregion in the Pyrenees that has suffered the ravages of depopulation like many others. One of the prime examples of this 20th century phenomenon is Ainielle, which Julio Llamazares used as the setting for his novel *La lluvia amarilla*, now completely uninhabited. The route crosses an evocative mid-mountain landscape.

## La Espelunga

### **Albarracín-Torres de Albarracín** (PR-TE 1)

With the gorgeous town of Albarracín as the start point, this short-distance path runs along a traditional trail that connects it to the nearby town of Torres de Albarracín, traversing rugged terrain.







### **Talamantes- Collado del Campo (GR 90)**

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## /CLIMBS



With the Pyrenees to the north and the mountain ranges of the Iberian System to the south, 43% of the surface area of Aragon is mountainous.

Additionally, Aragon is home to the highest summit and the largest number of three-thousanders in the entire Pyrenees (more than 150, with Aneto as the highest) and also the highest summit of the Iberian System (Moncayo).

All these are, without a doubt, highly attractive for mountaineers and hikers alike, but it is worth mentioning that all mountain activities require skill, preparation and specific technical equipment.

To avoid unwanted accidents and to enjoy the mountains to the fullest, we advise you to take a look at the website of the Montaña Segura (Safe Mountaineering) campaign ([www.montanasegura.com](http://www.montanasegura.com)) and to follow the 3 simple steps there: PLAN the activity, EQUIP your rucksack and EXERCISE caution.

The climbs listed below are only some examples of the huge number of peaks to be found on Aragonese territory for all mountain enthusiasts.

## THREE-THOUSANDERS

### Aneto (3404 m)

Aneto is the highest summit in the Pyrenees and the most iconic of the largest group of three-thousanders in the range, all found within the Posets-Maladeta Natural Park. Thousands of mountaineers come from near and far every year to climb it, but skill, preparation and suitable equipment are an absolute must.

One of the last glaciers in the Pyrenees is found here.

## TWO-THOUSANDERS

### Bisaurín (2670 m)

Bisaurín is the highest summit in the La Jacetania region, in the westernmost part of the Pyrenees in Aragon. The classic route for the climb starts out from the Lizara refuge and its rocky summit affords magnificent panoramic views of the surrounding landscapes.

### Javalambre (2 020 m)

## MIL-THOUSANDERS

### Oroel (1770 m)

The Peña Oroel is the emblem of the city and Campo de Jaca. It is a natural watchtower that looms above the Pre-Pyrenean landscape of this area with its characteristic ship's shape. The classic climb of its north face is also suitable for families.

### Santo Domingo (1 525 m)

Santo Domingo offers a couple of ways to climb up and hike, combining effort, a mountain atmosphere and sweeping panoramic views of the Ebro Valley and the Pyrenees, right in the heart of the Sierra de Santo Domingo Protected Landscape.

### Montsec (1331 m)

The Sierra de Montsec mountains are a long wall of limestone straddling Aragon and Catalonia. Its summit is reached by a route waymarked as a Short-Distance Path, which is also a birdwatching route, in an area that holds hidden delights waiting to be discovered.



### Penyagalerà (1 035 m)

It is one of the most iconic summits of the Upper Matarraña, located right on the Puertos de Beceite, in the valley of the River Ulldemó. From this conglomerate mountain, a large part of the rugged terrain, criss-crossed by rivers with enchanting pools, can be seen.

Accessible routes for everyone and highly recommended for families



### Pradera de Ordesa

From the Pradera de Ordesa until the Cotatuero Bridge, the heart of the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park is accessible for the general public.

### Linza

Within the Valles Occidentales Natural Park, the trail sets off from an area with meadows to enter the magnificent beech forest of Gamueta.

### La Tamara

Within the Sierra y Cañones de Guara Natural Park, this trail gives you the chance to explore a well-known section of the River Alcanadre and to feast your eyes on the rugged landscape.

### Shrine of Santa María de Iguácel

The Garcipollera Valley to the north of Jaca is home to one of the Romanesque jewels of the Pyrenees in Aragon: the Shrine of Santa María de Iguácel, in a tranquil setting amidst pine forests.

### El Cornato

At the entrance to the Pineta Valley, quite near the Ordesa y Monte Perdido National Park, you have the chance to bask in a beautiful forest.

Found at the entrance to the lovely Tena Valley, its surroundings receive plenty of visits as their great beauty is further heightened by the presence of a dolmen and the proximity of the cave shrine of Santa Elena.

### Isábena Viewpoint

It looks out over the Isábena Valley, one of the few unregulated rivers of the Pyrenees in Aragon, through a pine forest with deciduous species.

### Dornaque to the Buena Fountain

The Pinares de Rodeno Protected Landscape is accessible to the general public thanks to this trail that starts out from the Dornaque Interpretation Centre.

### El Navazo cave paintings

Within the limits of the Pinares de Rodeno Protected Landscape, the area of El Navazo has numerous small caves with cave paintings, amidst an atmosphere replete with mystery and natural beauty.
